**2011 Class and Faculty**

*Craniofacial Surgery is a sub-specialty of plastic surgery. It traces its roots to a group of surgeons who were interested in the treatment of birth defects in children involving the skull and face. In the late 1960s, Dr. Paul Tessier from Paris, France reported on techniques he has developed to treat children with rare birth defects. Following these initial reports, many surgeons from around the world traveled to Paris to learn these new procedures. Building on these beginnings, and the contributions of other surgeons, the field of craniofacial surgery was born. Today, new and refined craniofacial techniques are used, not only to treat birth defects in children, but also to help neurosurgeons resect tumors that were previously believed to be unresectable, help reconstruct the face and skull following trauma, and even expand the scope of aesthetic surgery.*

## **Course Objective and Description:**

The course is designed to teach new craniofacial fellows the basic major craniofacial osteotomies so they can practice craniofacial surgery safely and successfully. The setting will be both didactic lecture and cadaver lab dissection.
